		i. Health plan was changed to a higher deductible plan. This saved the district \$25,000. We also have funds held in order to cover the difference in the out of pocket maximums for the employees.
		ii. Uncollected taxes are projected to be higher this year, but this will be temporary and the money will be received in later years.
	В.	Budget Overview.
		i. \$120,000 was borrowed from the Building Reserve to balance the budget and \$60,000 was added to the Building Reserve to pay back the previous loan.

	ii.	Draft budget supports 7 line firefighters. Not sure if this will be sustainable in the future, because the budget continues to run a deficit maintaining 7 line firefighters.
	iii.	There are some more minor cuts than can be made, but funds can be moved around in between line items as long as they stay within their category (Materials & Services, Capital Outlay, or Personnel Services) without requiring a Supplemental Budget.
	iv.	In Capital Outlay, funds have only been appropriated in case they need to be spent on larger ticket items.
	V.	\$750,000.00 had to be cut out the original budget projections in order to balance the budget.
<u> </u>	Budg	et Committee Comments.
	i.	Mary Ellen Fitzgerald: Budget Members please speak up and provide your input.
	ii.	Gaynell Thornbrough: If there is too much more cutting of the budget, we could be sorry. Hoping for better tax collection and revenue in 2021-2022 Budget.
	iii.	Gretchen McAbery: Doing more "nickel and dime" cuts is not going to make a big enough difference. The draft budget is balanced and meets the desires of the community. 24 hour coverage provides better service but it may not be able to be supported in the future.
	iv.	Sally Chester: Paid staff should have been more involved in the Budget process. Suggestion to schedule a third budget meeting to allow the paid staff the opportunity to be more involved so they are not feeling left out.
	V.	Kirk Peterson: Thanks to the Interim Fire Chief and the Board for the work that you have done under difficult circumstances. Not optimistic about property tax collections rates being as expected.
	vi.	Cliff Fortune: This has been a long and difficult process to narrow the budget down. Strategic Planning meetings will be starting next month in June 2020. Members can be involved in the Strategic Planning and have input.

vii. Jacob Rackley: Budget input was provided by the career staff whe they submitted their budget requests. There were also Union negotiations where the staff had the opportunity to come up with plans to balance the budget. Because of the cuts that had to be
made to balance the budget, no one is going to be happy.
